ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

Public and Environmental Health professionals are challenged daily on compliance issues related to the safety of North Carolinians in their efforts to regulate and enforce the laws and rules that protect us. This course will provide the knowledge and skills necessary to increase confidence in the field and in the office for a better, safer NC. This course will satisfy the requirement for an environmental health law course based on North Carolina laws and rules with at least 15 contact hours approved by the REHS Board. This course shall be completed within the first four years of the date of the most recent registration by the REHS board.

OBJECTIVES

Participants in this workshop will:

- Explore NC environmental health laws and rules and how to interpret and translate the legal jargon into practical application
- Apply communication skills and basic health law fundamentals for proper documentation and legal remedies to difficult and complex situations
- Examine ethical issues and decision making strategies through case examples and group discussion
- Clarify the roles and relationships of the public health and legal system representatives for various situations

ABOUT THE FACULTY

Jill Moore, MPH, JD, is a UNC School of Government faculty member who specializes in public health law. Professor Moore received her MPH from the University of North Carolina in 1988 and her law degree from the University of North Carolina in 1996. Before joining the SOG faculty in 1997, she clerked for the Honorable Willis P. Whichard, North Carolina Supreme Court. Her research and teaching areas include the legal roles, powers and duties of local public health agencies, boards, and directors in North Carolina; communicable disease control law; HIPAA and medical confidentiality law; legal issues associated with treating minors; environmental health law; and selected legal issues associated with providing public health services to immigrants.

Other public health and legal professionals will lend their expertise throughout the course via case examples, lecture and group discussion.
